TO CALIBRATE

To standardize; bring ***into conformity with a standard*** by determining the deviation so as to ascertain the proper correction factors needed to adjust precisely for a particular function

' I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ***Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind***, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.'

Romans 12:1-2 (ESV)

Recalibrating means adjusting the way we think and live so ***we are aligned with Christ*** — remembering who He is, realising where we are off-course, and ***returning to His standard*** of life and love.

The process of Recalibration:

Standard – What is the standard?

Standard - Something established by authority, custom, or general consent as a model or example: a rule of measurement

' The law of the Lord is perfect, **reviving the soul**;
the testimony of the Lord is sure, **making wise the simple**;
the precepts of the Lord are right, **rejoicing the heart**;
the commandment of the Lord is pure, **enlightening the eyes**;
the fear of the Lord is clean, **enduring forever**;
the rules of the Lord are true, and **righteous altogether**.
More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold;
sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb.
Moreover, by them is your servant warned; **in keeping them
there is great reward.** '

The process of Recalibration:

Standard – What is the standard?

Difference – Determine the Diviation

We drift when:

The Word is not our standard.

When what we feel or see becomes more authoritative than God's Word, we begin to lose direction.

We don't examine our hearts.

God needs to search us (Psalm 139:23–24) — not to shame us, but to refine us.

We stop changing and start justifying.

Recalibration involves repentance — turning our minds and hearts back to God.

The process of Recalibration:

Standard – What is the standard?

Difference – Determine the Diviation

Conformity – Correct to Conformity

The Path of Recalibration

The Bible gives a pattern for recalibration that connects deeply with our 2026 year focus:

Remember God

Remember what He has done — not just in Scripture, but in your story. Remember His faithfulness and who He is. This restores perspective.

Represent Jesus

Christ is our standard — not religion, not performance, not tradition. To represent Jesus is to live His life in us - out into the world.

Reflect His Glory

Transformation is not about looking holy — it's about becoming like Jesus so others see Him.

Be Revived in Christ

God doesn't just want external obedience; He wants a renewed heart and a revitalised spirit.


